ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

1. The State of Haryana (Project Implementing Entity or PIE) will implement the Gurugram Metro Rail Project (GMRP) as Phase 1 of Sustainable Multimodal and Resilient Transport for Haryana through Gurugram Metro Rail Limited (GMRL), a Special Purpose Vehicle established by the Government of India and the State Government of Haryana (Implementing Agency), as set out in the Loan Agreement between India (Borrower) and the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (World Bank (WB) or the Bank) and the Project Agreement between the WB, the State of Haryana and GMRL (collectively, the Legal Agreements). The WB has agreed to provide financing for the Project, as set out in the Legal Agreements.
2. The PIE and GMRL shall ensure that the Project is carried out in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs) and this Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP), in a manner acceptable to the WB. The ESCP is a part of the Legal Agreements. Unless otherwise defined in this ESCP, capitalized terms used in this ESCP have the meanings ascribed to them in the Legal Agreements.
3. Without limitation to the foregoing, this ESCP sets out material measures and actions that the GMRL shall carry out or cause to be carried out, including, as applicable, their respective timeframes; institutional, staffing, training, monitoring and reporting arrangements and grievance management. The ESCP also sets out the environmental and social (E&S) documents that shall be prepared or updated, consulted, disclosed and implemented under the Project, consistent with the ESS, and in form and substance acceptable to the WB. Said E&S documents may be revised from time to time with prior written agreement by the WB. As provided for under the referred Legal Agreements, the GMRL shall ensure that there are sufficient funds available to cover the costs of implementing the ESCP.
4. As agreed by the WB, the PIE and GMRL, this ESCP will be revised from time to time, if necessary, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes or unforeseen circumstances or in response to Project performance. In such circumstances, the PIE, GMRL and the WB agree to update the ESCP to reflect these changes through an exchange of letters signed between the WB, the PIE and GMRL. The GMRL shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
5. The subsection on “Indicators for Implementation Readiness” below identifies the actions and measures to be monitored to assess Project readiness to begin implementation in accordance with this ESCP. Nevertheless, all actions and measures in this ESCP shall be implemented as set out in the “Timeframe” column below irrespective of whether they are listed in the referred subsection.
